## <u>Featured Art Museum</u>

## São Paulo Museum of Art

The **São Paulo Museum of Art** (<u>Portuguese</u>: *Museu de Arte de São Paulo*, or *MASP*) is an <u>art museum</u> located on <u>Paulista Avenue</u> in the city of <u>São Paulo</u>, Brazil. It is well known for its headquarters, a 1968 concrete and glass structure designed by <u>Lina Bo Bardi</u>, whose main body is supported by two lateral beams over a 74 meters (243 ft) freestanding space.<sup>[4]</sup> It is considered a landmark of the city and a main symbol of modern Brazilian architecture. The museum was founded in 1947 by <u>Assis Chateaubriand</u> and <u>Pietro</u> <u>Maria Bardi</u>, and is maintained as a non-profit institution. MASP distinguished itself by its involvement in several important initiatives concerning <u>museology</u> and <u>art education</u> in Brazil, as well as for its pioneering role as a cultural center. It was also the first Brazilian



museum to display <u>post-World War II</u> art. The museum is internationally recognized for its collection of European art, considered to be one of the finest in both Latin America and the <u>Southern Hemisphere</u>. It also houses an important collection of <u>Brazilian art</u>, <u>prints</u> and drawings, as well as smaller collections of <u>African</u> and <u>Asian</u> <u>art</u>, <u>antiquities</u>, <u>decorative arts</u>, and others, amounting to more than 8,000 pieces. MASP also contains one of the largest art libraries in the country. The entire collection was placed on the Brazilian National Heritage list by Brazil's Institute of History and Art.

## **Featured Non-SVA Artist**


### Salvador Dali

Salvador Domingo Felipe Jacinto Dalí i Domènech, Marquess of Dalí of Púbol, known as Salvador Dalí was a Spanish <u>surrealist</u> artist renowned for his technical skill, precise draftsmanship, and the striking and bizarre images in his work.

Born in <u>Figueres</u>, <u>Catalonia</u>, <u>Spain</u>, Dalí received his formal education in fine arts in Madrid. Influenced by <u>Impressionism</u> and the <u>Renaissance</u> masters from a young age he became increasingly attracted to <u>Cubism</u> and avantgarde movements.<sup>[2]</sup> He moved closer to Surrealism in the late 1920s and joined the Surrealist group in 1929, soon becoming one of its leading exponents. His best-known work, *The Persistence of Memory*, was completed



in August 1931, and is one of the most famous
