# Le Gallerie Degli Uffizi

The **Uffizi Gallery** (<u>UK: /iu:'frtsi, ʊ'fi:tsi/, yoo-*FIT-see, uu-FEET-see*;<sup>[3][4]</sup> Italian: **Galleria degli Uffizi**, pronounced [galle'ri:a de/A uf'fittsi]) is a prominent <u>art museum</u> located adjacent to the <u>Piazza della Signoria</u> in the <u>Historic Centre of Florence</u> in the region of <u>Tuscany</u>, Italy. One of the most important Italian museums and the most visited, it is also one of the largest and best known in the world and holds a collection of priceless works, particularly from the period of the <u>Italian Renaissance</u>.</u>



After the ruling House of Medici died out, their

art collections were given to the city of Florence under the famous *Patto di famiglia* negotiated by <u>Anna Maria Luisa</u>, the last Medici heiress. The Uffizi is one of the first modern museums. The gallery had been open to visitors by request since the sixteenth century, and in 1769 it was officially opened to the public, formally becoming a museum in 1865.<sup>[5]</sup>

# Featured Non-SVA Artist

### Winslow Homer

**Winslow Homer** (February 24, 1836 – September 29, 1910) was an American <u>landscape painter</u> and <u>illustrator</u>, best known for his marine subjects. He is considered one of the foremost painters in 19th-century America and a preeminent figure in American art.



Largely self-taught, Homer began his career working as a commercial <u>illustrator</u>.<sup>[1]</sup> He subsequently took up <u>oil</u> <u>painting</u> and produced major studio works characterized by the weight and density he exploited from the medium. He also worked extensively in watercolor, creating a fluid

Attendees need to bring 3 eggs (room temp), a taper candle & holder and pencil. MIN. ATTENDEES: 10

Kathleen Preininger-Johns is a renowned artist in the ethnic art of Pysanky. As owner of Oval Art, she has created hundreds of designed eggs for art galleries and collectors across the country. Over the past 30 years Kathleen has taught the 2,000 year old folk art through schools and art workshops, exhibited in juried art shows nationally and won awards for her one of a kind pieces of artwork. She has donated eggs to several charitable organizations and has two goose eggs designs in the White House permanent collection. She is dedicated to keeping the art of Pysanky alive through her workshops and demonstrations.

A Message From your A&GC Organizer, Marla Payne:

"I wanted to start drawing but lacked motivation. I just couldn't follow through

with starting on my own, so I posted on Facebook that I was going to be at SVA to work on art. I said bring whatever you want to work on and just be with people. So, on this day, March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018, about 6 people showed up and we grew from there! I found out that many in the community had the same issue that I did, lack of motivation, fear of not being good enough and just wanted to be around other like-minded people! New ideas, new art forms and all in a non-threatening, non-judging environment.

There was no cost involved (donation only) which allowed people who normally had no access to materials but wanted to do art the means to get back into it or explore the art world for the first time.

I grabbed some supplies of different mediums and made sure people understood this would be a nonjudgmental and open atmosphere where everyone from beginners to professionals were welcome in a non-discriminatory, open environment. Today, we have had as many as 30 people at once and have a good core group of up to 15-20 that show up! "


